STAKEHOLDER ANALYSIS

(qualitative data - preliminary results)

Data: 110 respondents

LEVEL	DOMINANT MOTIVATION
Political level	 Access to expertise, knowledge Data collection, access to data EU strategy to guide national strategy Collaboration, exchange good practices across EU
Strategic level	 Collaboration, exchange good practices across EU Access to expertise, knowledge Data collection, access to data
Implementation level	 Quality of care (quality professionals) Access to expertise, knowledge EU strategy to guide national strategy





STAKEHOLDER ANALYSIS

(preliminry results)

- Similarities across levels
- Access to expertise and knowledge
- Differences across levels
- Political and strategic: collaboration and networking, data collection Implementation: quality of care, improvement (e.g. training focus)
- Further, in-depth analysis needed
- Differences might imply that different communication and dissemination strategies are needed





KNOWLEDGE BROKER NETWORK

Plans for the future:

- Continue with meetings
- More feedback on deliverables of JA, responses to requests of WPLs

New series of webinars:

- feedback and suggestions on the network management (country and professional)
- exchanging information: up to date
- > feedback, recommendations, discussion based on deliverables
- ➤ Invite WP experts to present important deliverables
- > Facilitation of country progress in implementing planning methodologies
- Use meetings and network to disseminate country developments and progress

Points of attention:

- Reaching out to professional organizations
- Sustainability of network & development and support of national platforms





DISCUSSION

- > participants will be divided into 4 groups
- each group will receive 2 statements to discuss
- > every statement includes supportive questions to feed the debate
- there will be one facilitator, one note taker, one time keeper and one speaker appointed in every group
- > total time for this excercise is 45 minutes (20 minutes for each statement + 5 minutes for summary within the group)
- > at the end of the group discussion session, the speaker will present the results to all of the participants

The aim of this discussion is open debate: "think tank without limitations" in scope. Participants are encourged to speak openly and freely on the proposed statements.





STATEMENT 1: Communication and JA content

"The communication and dissemination of current deliverables is sufficient."

Supportive questions:

- 1) How can communication with regard to specific deliverables be improved?
- 2) Do you think that stakeholder target groups should be identified for each specific deliverable? How? With the use of what means?
- 3) What dissemination tools (innovative) would you suggest to foster the dissemination of the JA deliverables?
- 4) Would it be helpful to organize webinars by particular work packages to communicate work package results and present approved deliverables?





STATEMENT 2: Communication and involvement of stakeholders

"The European professional organizations can support the national level organizations and their constituency organizations in disseminating JA deliverables and its use in practise."

Supportive questions:

- 1) How can communication with regard to specific deliverables be tailored to different stakeholders (e.g. country level and professional organizations european and national)?
- 2) Would the merge of In-country and Professional knowledge broker network empower the stakeholder activity and interests towards the JA results?
- 3) Do you have experiences of similar kind from elsewhere? (different project or some other joint initiative)
- 4) Can professional organizations facilitate the development of in-country platforms?
