Starting from the laws...key points for planning

- Short term forecasting of healthcare professionals (yearly)
- Medium term forecasting of the number of physicians by speciality (three-years)
- Items to consider in the estimates calculation:
 - ✓ objectives and essential level of assistence indicated by Health National Plan;
 - ✓ organisational models of services;
 - ✓ employment offer;
 - ✓ work demand, considering healthcare professionals not yet working and those in training
- > Items to consider in the specialisation training contracts allocation:
 - ✓ training capacity of each Italian University
 - ✓ assistential volume of health structures of the training network





Steps in the Italian Health Workforce planning

Forecasting health workforce needs from Regions' and health professional Associations' data

Data collection, synthesis and analysis

Data comparison between Regions and health professional Associations (Boards and others)

Ministry of Health <u>proposes</u> NHS workforce needs

Government-Regional Agreement

Communication of results to Ministry of Education, University and Research to regulate the access to academic courses

National needs = Σ Regional needs




Bottom-up approach to NHS human resources forecasting





