What have we done up to now

- Selection of 7 countries with planning systems with both supply and demand side: England, Norway, Denmark, Finland, the Netherlands, Belgium and Spain (source: Matrix, OECD, Other studies)
- Grid for the evaluation of their experiences (based on Matrix, literature and WP5 survey).
- Feed-back form the country experts.





What will we do together during this meeting.

- The material we have is a description of the planning systems in the form of a matrix with 7 countries and 5 characteristics which will be used during this meeting in four sessions.
- Two session include:
 - a Plenary presentation of the main strength and weakness of the planning system in each country
 - a group activity for a preliminary selection of best practices,
 based on the assessment of the Grid.





What will we do together

- There will be two group activities with the discussion and documentation of the opinions on the five elements we have used in describing the planning systems:
 - 1. How the planning system is organized
 - 2. Which goals are set and within which time frame
 - 3. How the planning process is connected with the consequent actions.
 - 4. Which data are really used in the planning.
 - 5. The type of the forecasting model ad its use.
