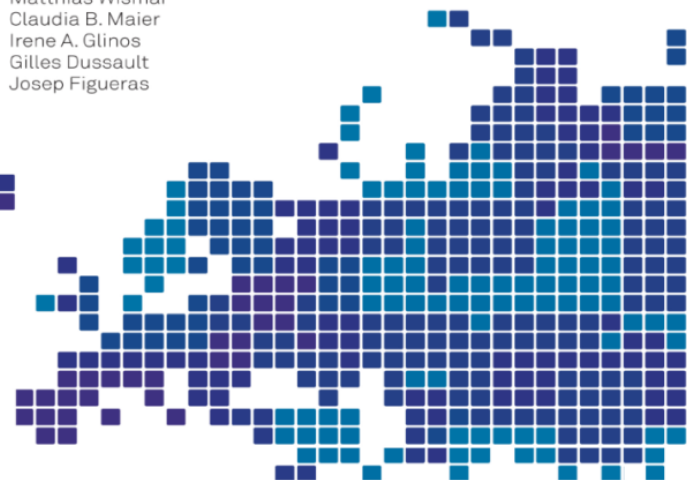

Policy brief:

- A report that:
 - begins with a policy issue
 - mobilises the relevant synthesized research evidence (problems, policy, practices, entities)
 - How can optimal skill mix be effectively implemented
- Target why?
- 25 p environment for health professionals
- Strict Do lifelong learning and revalidation ensure that physicians are fit to practice?



Policy summary:

- A summary of a larger study focusing on policy relevant findings
- Outline:
 - Introduction
 - Methods
 - Findings
 - Conclusions
 - Appendix
- Ca. 50 pages
- More flexibility
