



D052 Handbook on planning methodologies





The comprehensive model









The grid

(principal elements of a national planning system)

- 1. Which goals are set and with which time frame.
- 2. The type of the **forecasting model** and its use.
- 3. Which data is really used in the planning.
- 4. How the planning process is connected with the actions that will achieve what has been planned
- **5. How the planning system is organized** in order to guarantee a permanent process.





Inclusion criteria

- Criteria #1: The Joint Action will only assess the models that provide sound experimentations using both demand and supply based.
- **Criteria #2:** For practical reasons the Joint Action will only assess (geographic) European Models
- 3 Criteria #3: The model should make future projections
- 4 Criteria #4: WP5 partners



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Users demands on the Handbook (1)

WP7 (17/6)

- a) Different scenarios and contexts
- b) Clarity of structure of the Handbook with a "metastructure" that helps to orient the user.
- c) A content "evidence based" to make it clear that it is not "out of the blue".
- d) Test/self-evaluation for countries to estimate their situation.
- e) Ownership with authors from different countries with whom a user can identify.
- f) Contact details of national experts to contact whether info is still updated.





Users demands on the Handbook (2)


WP7 (17/6)

- g) Not only in English.
- h) A handbook of 400 pages.
- i) A set of leaflets to use as policy brief / advocacy material
- j) Link the health work force planning to "cost effectiveness planning' from a planning process point of view.
- k) The handbook shall contain specific software tools that helps the planner to make projections and build scenarios

Goals and timeframe

- ✓ Explicit overall goals
- ✓ Specific goals for each principal actor in the system





Type of forecasting model

- ✓ Supply, demand and population need?
- ✓ Different health service delivery settings.
- ✓ Interaction between demand and supply.
- ✓ Projection periods
- Consequences of health workforce projections in relation to other health system goals
- ✓ Frequency of updating health workforce forecasting exercises.
- ✓ Integration of different professional groups.
- ✓ Forecasting methods (quantity and qualitative)





Data set, data sources and methods

- ✓ Data sources used
- ✓ Level of aggregation of data
- √ Who reports the data
- ✓ Data collection specifically for planning or for other purposes and used for planning
- ✓ Creation of a unique data base for planning





Link between planning and policy actions

- ✓ Levers and actions that planners can manage to reach the goal.
- ✓ How to check if the goals are reached





Organization of the planning system

- ✓ At what level does workforce planning take place?
- ✓ Dedicated resources on all levels
- ✓ Specialization in particular professions and / or overview
- ✓ Organization of the workflow
- ✓ Organization of the stakeholders representation
- ✓ Which is the role of the stakeholders
- ✓ Responsibilities in the decision making process
- ✓ Communication
