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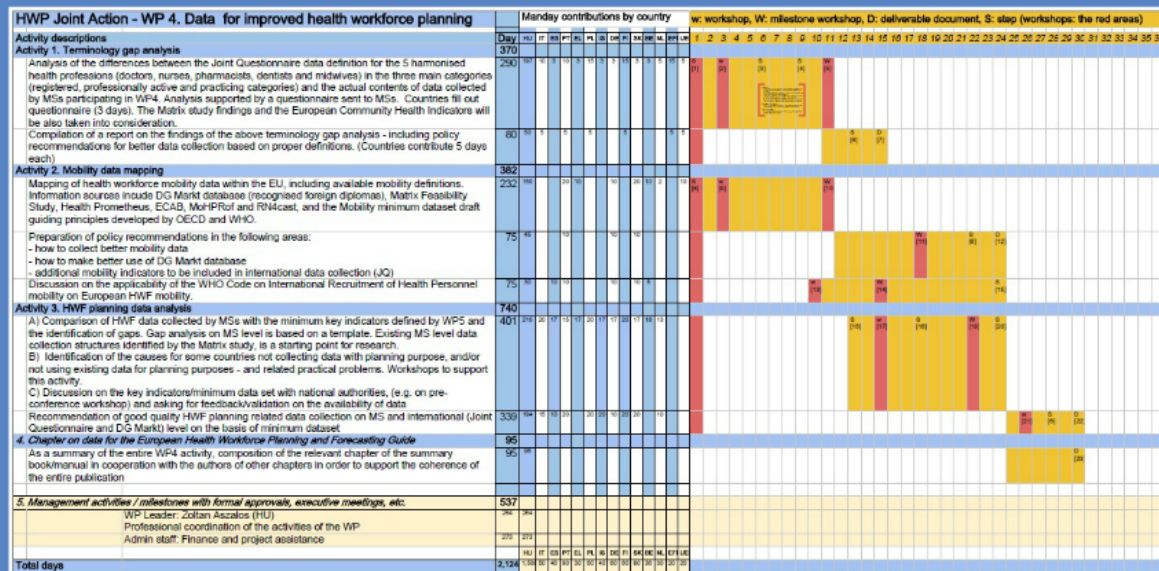




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HWP Joint Action - WP 4. Data for improved health workforce planning

Activity descriptions

Activity 1. Terminology gap analysis

Analysis of the differences between the Joint Questionnaire data definition for the 5 harmonised health professions (doctors, nurses, pharmacists, dentists and midwives) in the three main categories (registered, professionally active and practicing categories) and the actual contents of data collected by MSs participating in WP4. Analysis supported by a questionnaire sent to MSs. Countries fill out questionnaire (3 days). The Matrix study findings and the European Community Health Indicators will be also taken into consideration.

Compilation of a report on the findings of the above terminology gap analysis - including policy recommendations for better data collection based on proper definitions. (Countries contribute 5 days each)

Activity 2. Mobility data mapping

Mapping of health workforce mobility data within the EU, including available mobility definitions. Information sources include DG Markt database (recognised foreign diplomas), Matrix Feasibility Study, Health Prometheus, ECAB, MoHProf and RN4cast, and the Mobility minimum dataset draft guiding principles developed by OECD and WHO.

Preparation of policy recommendations in the following areas:

how to collect better mobility data

how to make better use of DG Markt database

Accuracy

- What kind of data source do you use when compiling data for the Joint Questionnaire on non-monetary health care statistics?
- Do you use estimates to respond to some data requests in the Joint Questionnaire? (Please explain)
- If the data are based on a sample from national data does it cover the whole country or a part of the country?
- Does your data include both public and private providers?
- Can you separate public providers from private providers?

Accessibility and Clarity

- Are data available according to the definitions in the Joint Questionnaire on non-monetary health care statistics?

ISCO Compatibility

- Do you use the recommended ISCO code for the respective health employment staff?

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Preparation of policy recommendations in the following areas:

- how to collect better mobility data
- how to make better use of DG Markt database
- additional mobility indicators to be included in international data collection (JQ)

Discussion on the applicability of the WHO Code on International Recruitment of Health Personnel mobility on European HWF mobility.

Activity 3. HWF planning data analysis

A) Comparison of HWF data collected by MSs with the minimum key indicators defined by WP5 and the identification of gaps. Gap analysis on MS level is based on a template. Existing MS level data collection structures identified by the Matrix study, is a starting point for research.

B) Identification of the causes for some countries not collecting data with planning purpose, and/or not using existing data for planning purposes - and related practical problems. Workshops to support this activity.
