

Objectives of WP 7

- Consolidating the experience of the JA

 → higher impact of HWF planning and forecasting on policy decision making: a review of the project objectives and results incl. the partners, needs and tasks to continue the activities after the Joint Action period in 2016.
- Propose an agenda of a network capable of supporting any rollout projects across the EU
 → with participants of WP4, 5 & 6 + identification of the EU experts





Mapping the technical outcomes of JA

The JA delivers through WP4, 5 and 6 several technical deliverables, which WP2 will promote towards EU/JA partners.

WP7 aims at:

- * defining the best path to enhance the uptake of this material
- * ensure its sustainability
- * designing the updated lexicon of HWF planning (WP4)
- * propose recommendations -> "trial" mobility data collection into routine
- * recommend next steps to use a common data set in the EU.





Mapping the technical outcomes of JA

WP7 will:

- * translate lessons of the "trial" WF forecasting projects (WP5)
- → a potential deployment strategy, including an updated methodology handbook produced.
- * use the advantage of both best practices in the usage of skills as a factor in WF planning and pilot projects (WP6)
- → to draw up technical recommendations
- → to enhance the current qualitative methodologies for planning (incl. a possible roll-out plan regarding WP6 products)





Recommendations for future actions in policy making

Definition of new initiatives + EU added value & identification of next steps for EU Action Plan on HWF

Output WP7 (+WP4):

- * consolidate the JA experience to issue a recommendation on the evaluation:
 - →data and the development of their monitoring
 - →collection at EU level with the objective to reach comparable
 - + quality data on HWF: country + EU level
- * produce a report with recommendations:
- →coordination of planning data collection
- →to serve as basis of future improvement:
- Joint Questionnaire on non-monetary health data of Eurostat
 - + OECD + WHO

Recommendations for future actions in policy making

WP7 will (based on the results of WP4):

- *develop a recommendation → a policy making process to go further → application of WHO Code on Intl Recruitment EU
- *propose future cooperation → HWF planning within EU or other international policy making event organised by e.g. OECD & WHO
- *examine added value for a new proposal to continue the European network on HWF planning (by the end of 2014)
- →aim: implement roll-out plans with support of technical and scientific expert groups in all EU members.
- *develop a business plan, incl. a cost/benefit analysis for JA: request co-funding under the Health Programme 2014-2020





Recommendations for future actions in policy making

WP7 will:

deliver a sustainability report

- → consolidating all proposals together
- + review of findings out of WP deliverable
- + out of the intermediate evaluation issued by WP3

Methods

Participation of WP7 experts as observer in WP4, 5, & 6 meetings. Content analysis of documents and reports, and analysis with WP leaders and key contributors of strengths and weaknesses of the JA products.

Establishing a network of experts in health workforce planning and timely information exchange.

Secure overview of the EU and international agenda (WHO/OECD) in close collaboration with the European Commission with the WP leaders to evaluate the needs of JA.






12) Methods

Review project objectives and results \rightarrow continuation + policy making (+ WP3).

WP7 will:

- * develop a recommendation as a follow-up of these work pieces +
- * take a shift to the future
- → Using network of knowledge brokers to collect a strong feeling of JA Partners sensibilities about perspectives by surveys to ensure neutrality + added value for all.

Most of the WP7 deliverables will be built in 3 round process: (1st + 2nd draft, then final draft) preceding the final document, to match with all 3 high level gathering organized by WP1 & 2 (JA Conference)
