













Planning system and education


 National authorities should work on planning system and educate students and professionals

 - Country is not member of EPSA




In regards of the supply of pharmacist, is your association aware of the current pharmacy workforce situation in your country?



 Undersuply of pharmacists should not be pirmarily solved my immigration but education




Undersuply of pharmacists

■ small ■ big ■ negligible


Comments/ Remarks

- Main barriers: financial, VISA


Main drivers for moving abroad

•	More work opportunities	81 %
•	High quality professional development	71 %
•	Better salary	62 %
•	Better quality of life	57 %
•	Better working condition	43 %
•	Having "higher social status"	43 %
•	Welfare of your own country is low	29 %
•	Easier access to continuous education	14 %
•	Tangible assets	14 %
•	Family	5 %

Results of mobility survey

- Slovak students study whole degree abroad - (309 out of 310 in Czech Republic for 2015/2016, response collected from 1 out of 2 faculties in Czech Republic)
- Spanish students take semestr/year abroad through Excange programmes (25 students monitored in 7 countries participating in the survey)
